Aaron Gott is a top-rated antitrust and appellate lawyer.

Aaron has litigated dozens of antitrust cases, serving as lead counsel in a majority of them. High profile antitrust cases where Aaron played a key role include FTC v Qualcomm, In re Disposable Contact Lens Antitrust Litigation, In re Capacitors Litigation, Salt River Agricultural Improvement District v. Tesla Energy, and North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners v. FTC (see sidebar for a more complete list).

Aaron has appeared before the U.S. Supreme Court and argued countless appeals in the U.S. Courts of Appeals. He is also one of the nation's leading lawyers on antitrust federalism and the state-action immunity.

Aaron also helps clients manage their antitrust risk by advising on antitrust compliance, as well as establishing and maintaining antitrust exemptions including farm cooperatives under the Capper-Volstead Act. He advises and represents clients in competition-related areas such as employment non-compete agreements, trade secret protection, and issues relating to partnerships and joint ventures.

Aaron is a combat veteran who served nearly a decade in the U.S. Army. Before law school, he was a professional writer as a newspaper editor and later as an Army public affairs officer. His legal scholarship has been called "meticulously researched and brilliantly argued," and showcased as "rigorous and elegant writing."
